


ISA GLOBAL REMOTE INTERNSHIP



Office of Equity, Diversity and Global Engagement (EDGE)

This year, EDGE partnered with ISA (International Studies Abroad) to offer Global Remote Internships over the summer. These entirely remote internships gave students the opportunity to work with companies and organizations in four countries (Vietnam, Peru, Australia, and Spain) for eight weeks of project-based work.
